Document Certification

Documents specified to be submitted as a Certified Copy, must be a certified true copy of the original. If certified true copies are completed by a Maltese lawyer, then no further legalisation is required. If one outside of Malta, then the certified true copy must also be apostilled or legalised (by the respective Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the respective Maltese Consulate/Embassy). Quote for certification in Malta upon request.

Document Translation

Any documents that are not in English, or containing any non-English elements, must be translated in English. If translations are completed in Malta, then no further legalisation is required. If translations are completed outside of Malta, then the certified translation must also be legalised (by the respective Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the respective Maltese Consulate/Embassy). Quote for certified translation in Malta upon request.
